



Innovation and Technology for Building Community

Survey Background

Given Telosa’s values of being open, fair and inclusive, we are using surveys as one mechanism to engage, learn, and co-create with our community. We are using a leading community engagement firm, Polco, to lead our survey efforts and leverage work that they have done on a national level with existing cities. This gives us access to a wider set of ideas and perspectives to benchmark our community’s response.

This was our fourth survey working with the Telosa community to design the city. This survey focused on a key component of Telosa – Community Engagement. The survey was administered with the intent to understand the engagement opportunities and activities currently happening in cities across the nation and respondent’s preferences for community engagement in the future.

Survey Methods

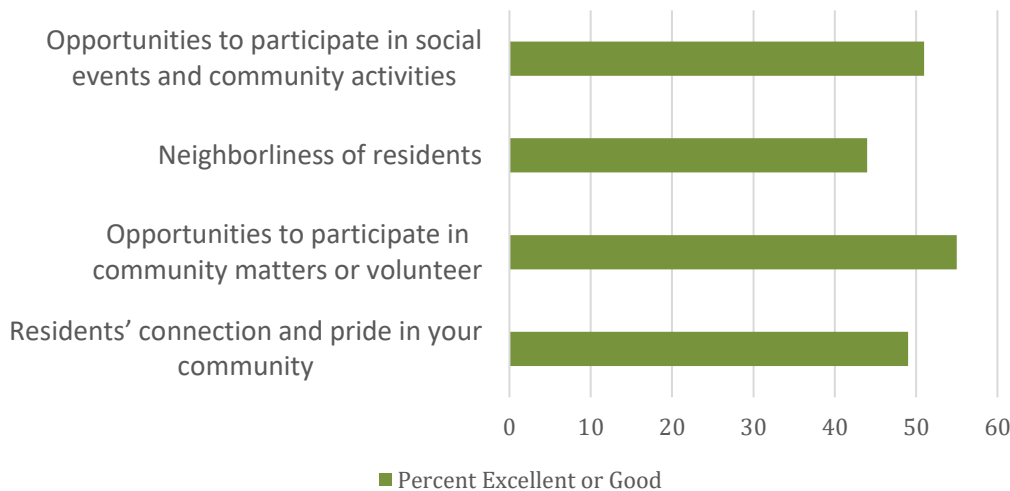
Respondents were recruited through a non-probabilistic, multi-contact method employing online invitations and social media campaigns. Respondents to the survey were self-selected people who expressed an interest in Telosa and learned about Telosa primarily through traditional media coverage.

The survey was administered on the Polco platform during the time period of November 15 to December 15, 2022. The outreach resulted in a total of 52 completed surveys. The intent is to build the representation of the Telosa panel over time so future surveys will bring not only a larger number of respondents but greater inclusivity to the survey results.

Highlights

Highlights of the survey are presented on the following pages. A full set of results is presented in a separate report.

Ratings of Community Engagement in Current Cities



Telosa followers gave average ratings to their cities in terms of engagement and rated the current inclusivity of their communities similarly. About 6 in 10 respondents indicated they would be likely to participate in a number the current activities offered (e.g. subscribe to emails, participate in a community forum.)

Factors Important to Increase Community Engagement



When asked which factors would be important in increasing their community engagement, **having something to contribute based on their experience and beliefs and interacting with a community of shared values were the most common responses.** The time commitment also was an important factor to many.

How Respondents Feel About the Technology to Help with Building Communities



- Not really needed, most community building should be done in person
- I'm willing to try a new way if it were easy to learn and access
- We need a better way to gather using all the new technology available

Although many of the Telosa respondents already were active on tech platforms, more than half felt a better way to gather using new technology was needed.

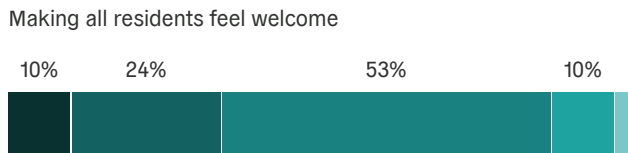
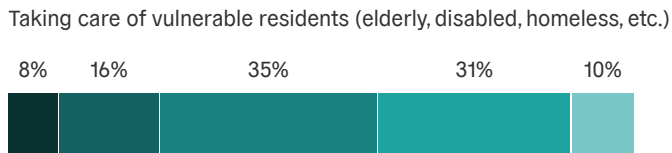
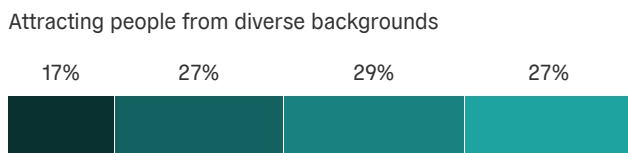

This particular community is great for taking care of its less fortunate, such as the homeless and drug-addicted. It is also good for providing an array of events and opportunities for donating and volunteering.

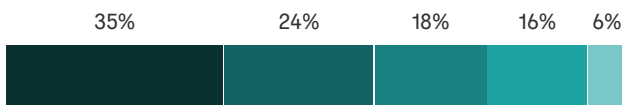

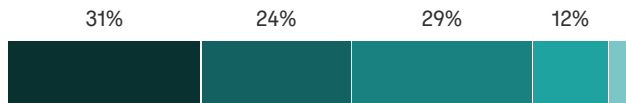

What is your preferred means of gathering in your community or meeting new people?



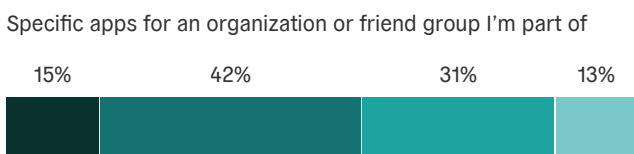
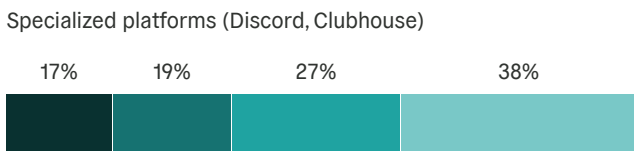
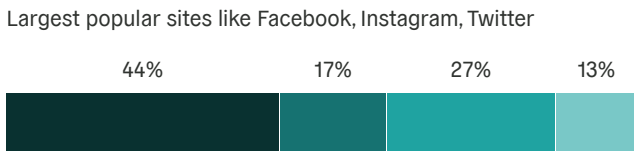
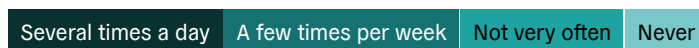

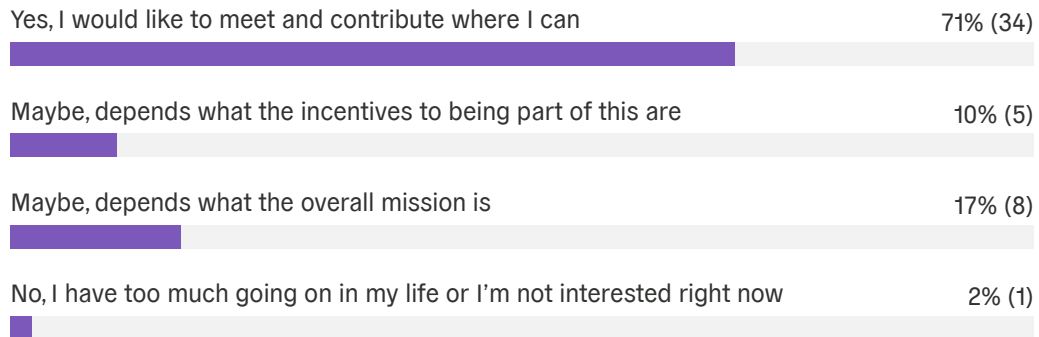
How do you feel about the technology to help with building communities?



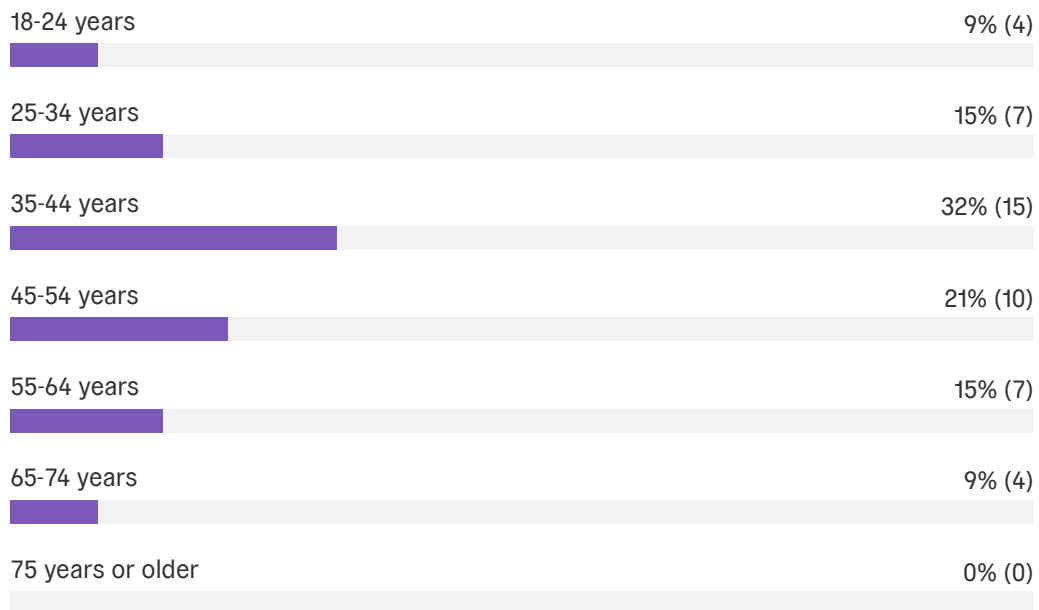
Why would you be hesitant to use technology to be part of a community? Please check all that apply.



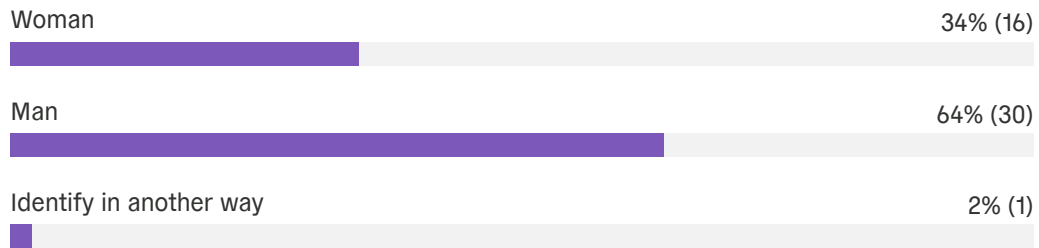
How would you respond if you were invited or could apply to be part of a special interest group in an area of your interest/expertise with other knowledgeable individuals to create something?



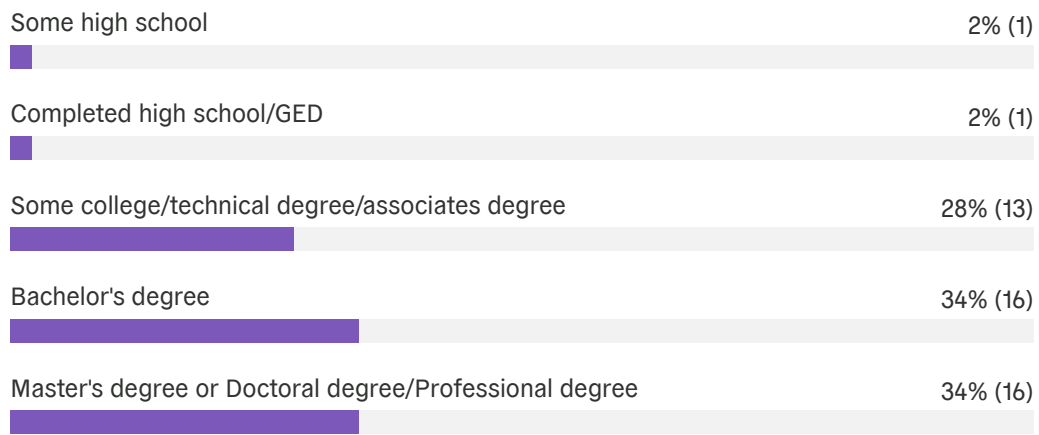
In which category is your age?



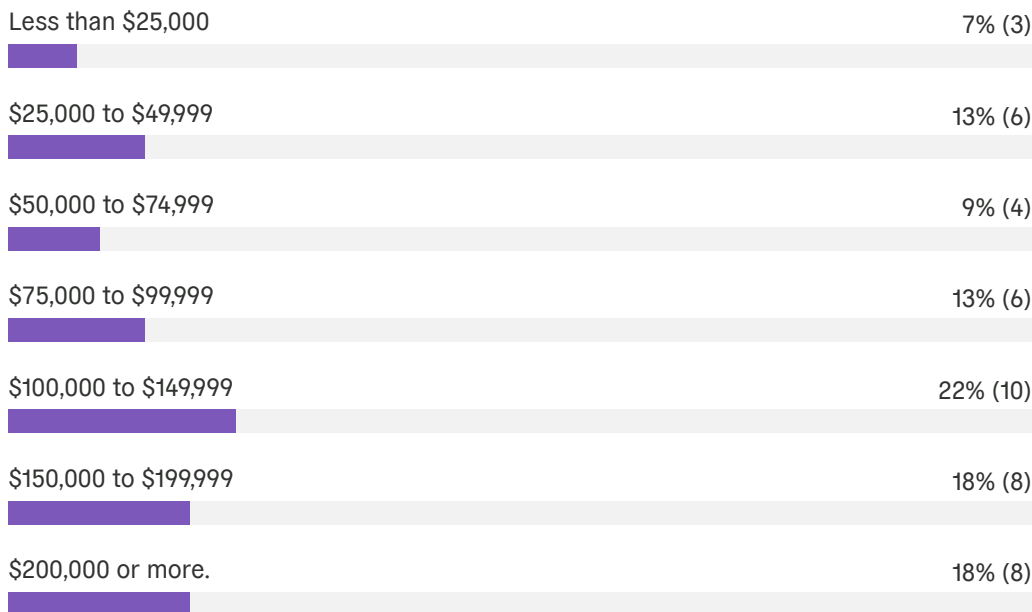
What is your gender?



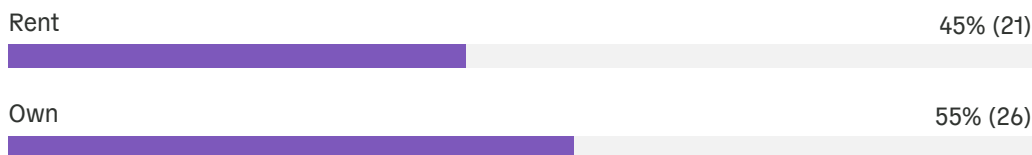
What is your highest completed level of education?



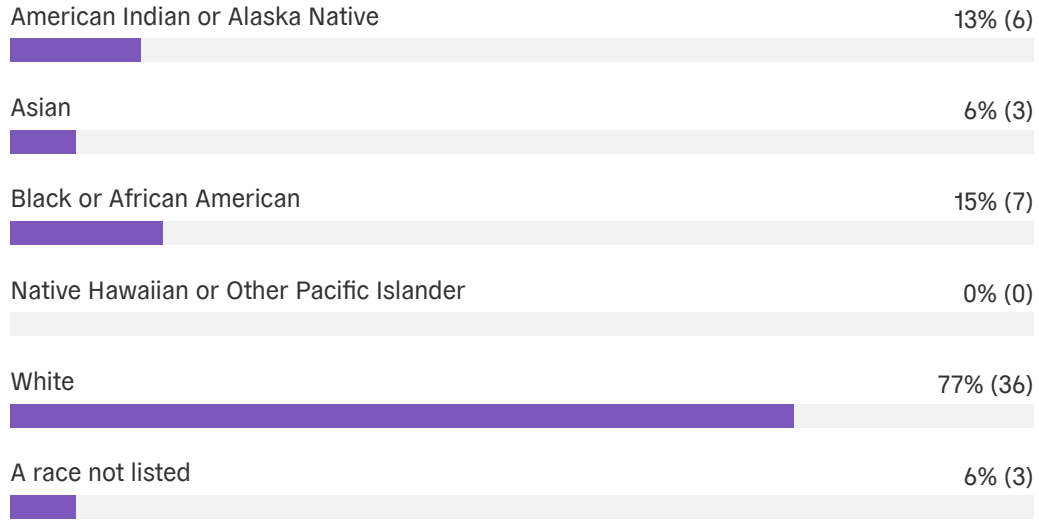
How much do you anticipate your household’s total income before taxes will be for the current year? (Please include in your total income money from all sources for all persons living in your household.)



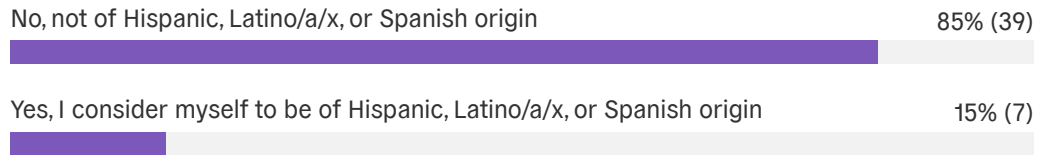
Do you rent or own your home?



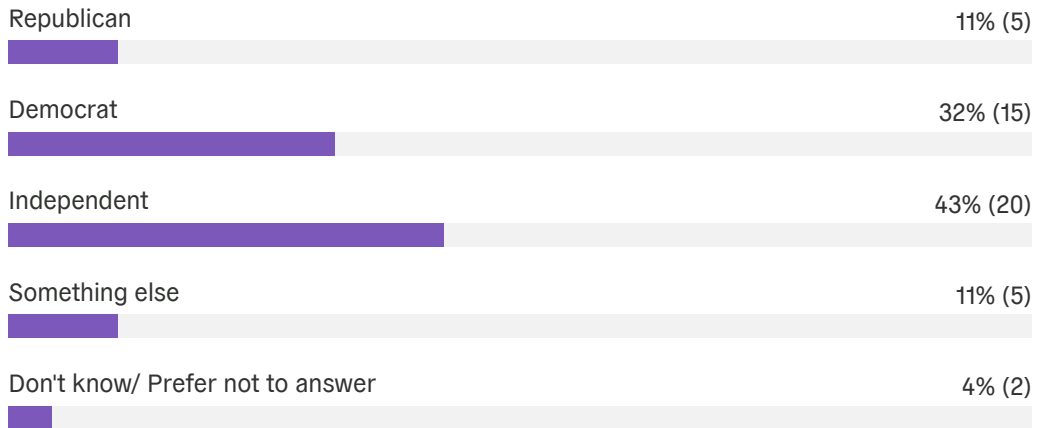
What is your race? (Mark one or more races to indicate what race you consider yourself to be.)



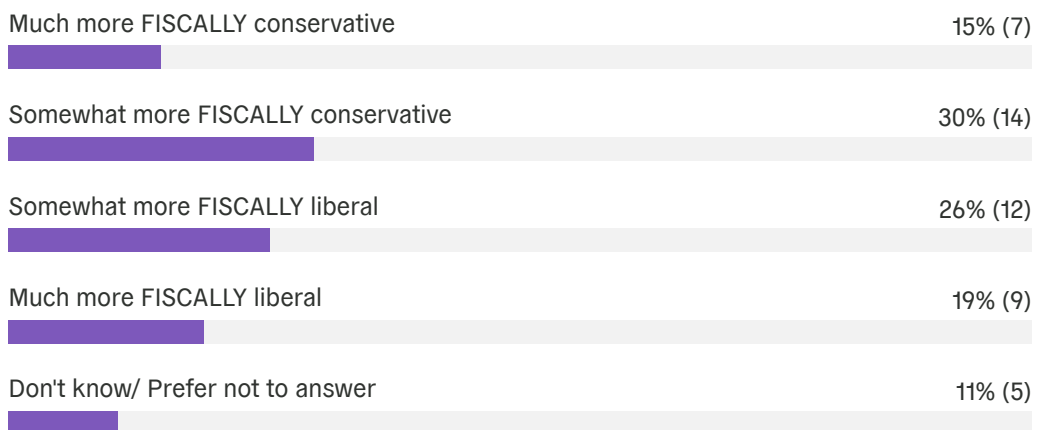
Are you of Hispanic, Latino/a/x, or Spanish origin?
